

The 1909 Conference

Outstanding Publication Award

The members of the 1909 Conference present an ***Outstanding Publication Award*** at the annual conference. This award is supported by the Technical Foundation of America. The 1909 Conference has a long history as a proving ground for research and new ideas in the profession —many of which eventually fill the pages of our professional journals and books. This award is designed to recognize that long tradition of scholarly purposes. This award recognizes the author who has published an impactful manuscript that was based on an original presentation delivered at a previous Joint conference of the 1909/STEC.

Procedure

All nominations must be submitted by September 20 to be considered. Once nominations are received, the 1909 Conference Awards Committee will review the applications and select the award recipient. The recipient will be recognized at the annual Joint Conference of the 1909/STEC with a plaque presented by the Technical Foundation of America. One award will be presented annually.

Guidelines

The guidelines for submitting a publication for consideration are as follows:

1. Self-nominations are encouraged, however any member or guest who has attended a previous Joint Conference of the 1909/STEC can nominate a publication/author for consideration;
2. All nominations must include an electronic pdf copy of the publication as well as a completed Outstanding Publication Award Nomination Form (Below);
 - a. If the publication has been accepted, but not published, the author may include a letter from the editor in the submission.
3. All nominations must be received by September 20 each year.

1. Name of author
2. Institutional affiliation of nominee
3. Date of original presentation (must be within two years of publication)
4. Title of original presentation
5. Reference citation of the published manuscript
6. In 200 words or less, describe how the publication migrated from an original presentation at 1909/STEC to a published manuscript, and the influence that the publication has had (or will have) on the profession after appearing in print.
